CHEMICAL DESCRIPTION: Derivative of butyl rubber which has been reacted

with bromine in a continuous process

PROPERTIES

ASTM classification: BIIR

Typical applications: Inner tyre tubes, breathing apparatus for defence

and fire services

Advantages: Low gas permeability

Excellent ozone resistance Good steam resistance Good fire resistance

Disadvantages: Poor resistance to oils and non-polar solvents

Available hardness range (Sh. A): 35 - 90

Upper continuous service temp. ($^{\circ}$): 130

Min. temp. for sealing applications. ($^{\circ}$): -50

Minimum non-brittle temp. (\mathfrak{C}): -70

Tensile strength (up to): 18 MPa

Elongation at break (up to): 650%
